#### PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICY

- PAC/PTA and Family Activities throughout the year
- Quarterly Report Cards
- RealTime (automated grade review)

Note: Macopin School will provide parents of participating children opportunities to participate in the Parent Advisory Committee and make suggestions relating to the education of their children through teacher meetings, surveys or prearranged meetings with the Title I Coordinator, the principal or other appropriate staff.

Parents at any time can submit comments/suggestions in writing regarding the school Parent Involvement Policy to their child's teacher, the Title I Coordinator or principal.

- 1.
