Students will enter via one of two doors, depending on your vehicle's position in the line. Staff will be on duty in the hallways to assist your children in getting to where they need to be. Please make every effort to drop your child(ren) off on time as school begins officially at 8:35. Being late can serve as a distraction to the class and result in lost instructional time for your child(ren).
- If you are picking up your child(ren), please arrive prior to **2:50** and wait outside by the main door. We will continue to dismiss students being picked up like we did last year. Students will begin to be called for dismissal around 2:50. Please bring a photo ID, such as a driver's license, with you to show the staff on duty.
- If you plan on picking your child(ren) up at dismissal the first day or any day for the remainder of the year, please send in a note or email <a href="mailto:mhspickup@gmail.com">mhspickup@gmail.com</a>. This is the best email address to communicate pickup changes to our main office.

This year, the federal free school lunch for all program has ended. Going forward, students will have to pay for their school lunch unless they qualify for free and reduced lunch.
